




- Reading and analyzing literature

- Key questions:
 - What does the author say?
 - How does the author say it?
 - What does the author mean?

Mathematics Standards

Emphasis on:


- Number sense place value, multiplication, division, fractions
- Understanding and analyzing patterns, ratios, and proportions
- Evaluating and solving expressions and equations with variables
- Recognizing and classifying figures and angles

- Analyzing and interpreting data






About the Test

- Adaptive
- Computer-based
- Assesses Reading and Math skills



About the Test

- Tests are administered in August/September, December/January, and May
- Must be completed in one session, in one day
- Different types of questions
 - Multiple choice
 - Multiselect
 - Table match
 - Two-part questions
 - Selectable text
 - Matching
 - Equation editor
 - Editing tasks





How are students tested?

¿Cómo se evalúan los estudiantes?

- •Reading: PM1/PM2- Up to 90 minutes, PM3- 120 minutes
- •Math: PM1/PM2- Up to 80 minutes, PM3- 100 minutes

Per the Florida Department of Education:

For PM1 and PM2, the Bureau of K–12 Student Assessment provides scheduling guidance in the test administration manual and scripts. For scheduling purposes, a recommended session length is provided, but students who are still working at the end of that time should be provided with the maximum allowable time as indicated in the table above. If students are still working at the end of that time, at the school's discretion, the student may continue until they finish the test (up to the end of the school day). For PM3, students must be provided with the total time indicated in the table.



Student Promotion Progression: How does my 3rd grade student progress to 4th grade?

• Students must score at a Level 2 or higher on the spring Grade 3 FAST – Benchmarks for Excellent Student Thinking (B.E.S.T.) English Language Arts assessment

• A student may demonstrate reading skills equal to or above a level 2 performance through the Grade 3 Reading Student Portfolio


 A student may demonstrate reading skills equal to or above a level 2 performance through the Grade 3 Iready PM 3 assessment



What is the Grade 3 Reading Student Portfolio?

¿Qué es el Portafolio del Estudiante de Lectura del Grado 3?

- The Grade 3 Reading Student Portfolio is used to gather information on students' Reading proficiency on the English Language Arts benchmarks assessed on the FAST Assessment. The portfolio provides multiple opportunities during the second semester to compile evidence of students' reading mastery, which may be used in promotion decisions.
- Grade 3 students who do not achieve the required minimum score on the FAST Assessment but have six acceptable demonstrations on each English Language Arts benchmark may be promoted to grade 4.
- These passages are completed in the classroom during the school day.
- Students will be administered a reading passage(s) weekly during their ELA class* and will be required to answer its corresponding questions that align to 3rd grade reading benchmarks.
- Students will take their portfolio assessments weekly on Tuesdays (unless specified by the teacher)
- Please check your teacher's weekly newsletter for updates on Portfolio dates and skills to review.

 - **■** Multi-select

Limited English proficient students who have had less than 2 years of instruction in an English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) program based on the Date of Entry into a U. S. School (DEUSS).

Students with disabilities whose Individual Education Plan (IEP) indicates that participation in the statewide assessment program is not appropriate.

How is the Grade 3 Reading Student Portfolio used for promotion?

- The portfolio provides multiple opportunities during the second semester to compile evidence of students' reading mastery, which may be used in promotion decisions.
- Each assessment contains multiple standards
- Students must show 6 acceptable demonstrations on each standard in order to receive mastery on their portfolio








How can families help?

- Ensure students attend tutoring sessions




